A MOVE TO WILBURTON

The first thing for Readers to note in their Diaries is my new Address, as shown at the top of this NEWS SHEET. Of course this isn't really quite a "standard" News Sheet, but I thought it best to number it '22' anyway for reference purposes. Its main purpose is to advise the NS Readership of my change of address, though there is coverage on CHESS COMPUTERS and an up-dated RATING LIST as well.

The actual address, of course, gives the game away to most folk. I came close to joining Michael Healey at Countrywide Computers when I went to Competence at the end of 1987, but promises had been made before Michael became aware of my situation and our discussions didn't really get a chance to develop properly. However I now believe that this is definitely the right move for me to make for various reasons. Some of them are personal - and please do not try reading into that comment things which aren't there! Terry Knight and I part on good, friendly terms. But I do feel that the move is good for my all-round involvement in Chess Computing... hopefully it will be good for Countrywide as well! I will have the opportunity to work with a much wider range of machines due to the full stock held at Countrywide - this suits me personally of course and will also be beneficial for my News Sheet 'hobby'. It will also enable a closer involvement with the widening range of Mephisto products. These are particularly exciting in my view at this time, and not just at the top end but also with Teaching and Training Features built into strong programmes at lower price levels which potentially can revolutionise the opportunities for learning and improvement for all players from newcomers to regular Club members.

However the NEWS SHEET is NOT going to become an exclusive advertisement for either Mephisto or anyone else but will continue as far as possible to provide as much helpful and informative coverage of Novag, Fidelity, Conchess, Saitek/Kasparov and CXG as possible as well as keeping an eye out for Personal Computer programmes of merit and the progress of the Main Frame programmes such as Deep Thought and Hi-Tech etc. As before, CONTRIBUTIONS FROM READERS will continue to be welcome.

What about a 'PROPER' News Sheet?!

Good question!

I am sure Readers will understand the delay behind this present Issue which is due to my move. Getting these things worked out with the various decisions that need to be made, then house-hunting with the subsequent upheaval of removing are never as simple as we might like to think. So the next NEWS SHEET will be out AS SOON AS WE'VE HAD CHANCE TO SETTLE IN! A first obligation is to Countrywide of course to become valuably involved as quickly as possible. RESULTS in "vs HUMAN" Tournaments

A FIDELITY EXCELLENCE came 3rd= with 3 out of 5 in the 1988 Southampton University Championship, grading 1942.
MEPHISTO's ALMERIA got an excellent 2233 from 10 games in the ROM'84 Tournament in Holland.
Spain's Computer Chess Magazine reports the following at AEGON 1988:-
NOVAG SUPER FORTE+TURBO 2057 from 6 games
FIDELITY MACH 2C 2055 from 6 games
MEPHISTO MEGA 4+TURBO 2030 from 6 games.
Fidelity U.S.A reports the FIDELITY MACH 4 scoring 4 1/2 from 6 getting 2236 USCF in the U.S AMATEUR TEAM CHAMPS. They also report the FIDELITY MACH 3 getting a very good 2151 from 7 games at PORZ (something of a graveyard for Chess Computers as a rule!).
At the WIENER SCHACH-COMPUTER CLUB:-
MEPHISTO ACADEMY+TURBO 6 out of 7 for 2167
KASPAROV LEONARDO+TURBO 3 1/2 out of 9 for 1974.
In the BARBICAN OPEN Action Chess, January 1989 NOVAG SUPER EXPERT/6 got 4 from 6 and a 2103 grade.
At VOLMAC:-
MEPHISTO MEGA 4 graded 2004 from 14 games
MEPHISTO ROMA 16 1929 from 14
NOVAG EXPERT/5 1725 also from 14.
In the KING'S HEAD Action Chess recently 2 of the new NOVAG SUPER EXPERT programmes scored 4 and 5 out of 6 respectively. The leading NOVAG missed 1= placing by just a 1/2 point and graded at around 2300! The second had a strange Bishop sacrifice bug as White yet still scored 4 after getting 3/3 with Black!
The NOVAG SUPER FORTE also won a Blitz Tournament in ZARAGOZA, SPAIN recently. Though the opposition wasn't so strong, you can't argue with a score of 13 1/2 from 14!
An Action Chess Tournament in FRANCE saw 4 Computers all score well over 8 games:-
MEPH ALMERIA 32 2303
NOV SUPER EXPERT/6 2275
FID MACH 4 2261
FID MACH 3 2064

My conclusion is that the leading Chess Computers continue to progress rather well! I have games from some of these Tournaments and will share some of them with you in NS23.

Pergamon Chess - COMPUTER CHESS SURVEY

I don't really enjoy grumbling about things. Firstly it just is not my basic nature and I like to feel that I encourage folk rather than anything else. Also I have learned how hard I sometimes find it to take probably well-meant "constructive criticism" when it is giving a thumbs-down to work I've spent literally ages on. However I have to say I was disappointed by the content of the CHESS COMPUTER SURVEY in Pergamon Chess' April Issue.

I didn't like the COMPARISON CHART at all. Because it listed machines in ascending price order it resulted in the cheapest machines appearing at the top whilst the best ones came near the bottom. Ordered Lists are very powerful things and it is usual to put the BEST at the TOP. The Price/Playing Strength "Evaluation" was very misleading. Though the writer of the Article may not like wood, auto-sensory Boards, MOST people definitely prefer them. Inevitably they are dearer, of course, so they consequently appear lower down on the COMPARISON CHART and get a much poorer "EVALUATION". This is simply not right! In any case my experience is that almost all purchasers are interested in QUALITY and FEATURES as well as PLAYING STRENGTH and they take these fully into consideration in deciding what is VALUE FOR MONEY for them. For every person for whom Strength is the main criterion there is another who is after best Features and another whose concern is for Quality, yes and Appearance! A CHART which divides Strength by Price CAN result in POOR Quality Machine with NOMINAL Features getting a MUCH higher "Evaluation" than it deserves. So the COMPARISON CHART was NOT a true COMPARISON CHART at all, but a STRENGTH/PRICE COMPARISON CHART. A TRUE Comparison Chart would need to be based on much more Information. SCHACH & SPIELE do such a Chart twice a year. Even then some folk are not SO keen on it as it involves SUBJECTIVE opinion dependant on which FEATURES each Panellist happens to prefer, and which STYLE of Board etc. But at least it INCLUDES a fuller range of ALL these important matters and it is (to me) notable that NONE of ITS TOP 5 appear very high on the STRENGTH/PRICE alone basis. In fact I rarely complete the forms sent for my "expert" opinion as they usually list machines I haven't had the chance to try out personally. To complete estimates for Features, Quality, Appearance, Reliability etc when you haven't actually seen some of the Machines is hardly right, so I prefer to miss out.

I DO believe a RATING LIST is of value - it is a mathematical statement based on factual results and not a matter of opinion. (I also think the "arcane, detailed, totally useless charts" are very helpful as well. If they're not, why is it that our customers are always asking for them?). I am not happy that my Rating List should have any additional formulas applied to it to create a new type of list (nor new Ratings supplied for Machines which are neither on my Rating List nor, in 2 or 3 cases, even due out for a month or two!). However I shall end and rest my case (for this Issue at least) on the BUYING RECOMMENDATION of "COMPUTACHESS"! Rather than a 'best buy', I would have always considered it a WORST buy!... no matter WHO the prospective purchaser. It would not be, for me, even remotely a 'best buy' for a reader of Beano or Dandy, never mind of Pergamon Chess. It is extremely plastic, the playing surface tends to curl up at the edges, the press-sensory system is poor, the LEDs small, there are no features (even Hint, Take-Back and Verify are non-existent, so how it can even start to help a beginner I've no idea.) And it can't play Chess! Give it the first moves of Fool's Mate with only the last to find - put it on its TOP Level - and it still can't do it! I hope there aren't too many people who've spent previous money on it following this dreaded Buying Recommendation. They'll be very disappointed and perhaps put off Chess Computers for a long time to come (as they'll think "If that's Pergamon CHESS' 'BEST Buy', what on earth can the others be like?").

What do other readers think?

COMPUTER CHESS REPORTS

Much better news here! Virtually unqualified support for a fine Publication. A proper review in the next Issue or, if you can't wait (and I wouldn't blame you!) write to COMPUTER CHESS REPORTS, P.O. Box 474, Merrick, New York 11566. Unfortunately there's no price shown on this Issue and, as I get mine free as a Contributing Editor (!), I can't tell you how much to send. I would guess at \$10 to cover postage, but if you did get a rude reply asking for more, please don't think too badly of me!

NEWS from the MANUFACTURERS

NOVAG reports a new improved range of lower priced Machines of good playing-standard and features, all now with memory-save. The Piccolo (portable) and Allegro machines are replaced by the stronger **SECONDO** and **ALLEGRO 4** respectively. **PRIMO** now has the nicely improved **SUPREMO** and the V.I.P Portable is receiving even more extensive treatment through the **SUPER V.I.P.** a 48K programme with TV port and link-up to optional Board. Work continues on the **SUPER EXPERT/FORTE** programme. According to Larry Kaufman an 8MHz version of the latest Programme is looking very good and this could be commercially available within a couple of months. Whether the Upgrade will enable existing owners to go to 8MHz - and what the cost might be - I don't know yet. But Paul Cohen at Eureka wrote me most helpfully and I should be able to let Readers have full details in NS23. What is promised is a 100 Elo leap!

FIDELITY has the **MACH 4** 32 bit version of the **MACH 3** due out virtually immediately. This runs at 20MHz and so achieves a speed of actually 2^{1/2} times that of the **MACH 3**! In the plastic Board it will be £1299; the **ELITE**, due out mid-summer, will be around £1499. This will clearly compete with the **ALMERIA 32** for top-spot on the **RATING LIST**.

MEPHISTO has the **ACADEMY** now out at £399. A fully auto-sensory wooden Board (exactly as **MONTE CARLO**) but with a clearly improved **MEGA 4** programme in it including a good Opening Book 6 times as big as **MEGA**'s and improved Chess knowledge. Excellent Display and range of Features and soon to have an accompanying quality Teaching Booklet designed to help even strong players improve their Chess in conjunction with the **ACADEMY**!

The **MEPHISTO EUROPA** already has an accompanying 100 page Booklet designed to help the owner use his **EUROPA** to learn the game and then improve to a good standard. The **MEPHISTO COLLEGE** (also known in the U.S.A as **SUPER MONDIAL II**) will be out soon with similar features to the **ACADEMY**, with Booklet etc, but at a cheaper price on a Press Sensory Board. The very wide range of Levels on these Machines enable each owner to get maximum value from his Computer and make full use of it to really learn the game properly. The only limitation is at top strength, so the **EUROPA** for example would not suit an already genuinely strong player in the same way **COLLEGE** and **ACADEMY** would.

SAITEK/KASPAROV hope to have the **RENAISSANCE** available in July. This will be the improved **LEONARDO/GALILEO** Board with **LEDs** on every square and will carry the latest and strongest version of the various **MAESTRO** and **ANALYST** programmes. The **CONQUISTADOR** and **CORONA** are already out and I will report on these as soon as I have sufficient information.

RATING LISTS.

As usual, my notes for newcomers:-

/5 after a machine indicates its processor SPEED - some programmes are available with different processors, so this helps distinguish between them.

+/- shows the maximum rating DEVIATION likely for that machine. It is 95% certain that its Rating will stay within its +/- range. Thus the more games played, the more reliable the Rating... and vice-versa!

Human Games Column repeats Info. from the vs HUMANS List. These figures are used to adjust the OVERALL LEVEL of the RATING LIST as well as each SPECIFIC machine's own Rating. Some (other!) people feel that the vs HUMANS List is more useful than my MAIN one which includes BOTH the Computer v Human AND Computer v Computer Results.

* after a Machine in the vs HUMANS List indicates that it's NOT COMMERCIALY available in that form as far as I know. If it comes onto the market, the '*' will be removed. This applies particularly to the "+TURBO" machines which are often heavily boosted EXPERIMENTAL versions.
